MARK WOLF, REAL ESTATE DEVELOPMENT INTERVIEW Y RTN DANA CARON

Portland, Maine (Rtn Dana) interviewed Portland, Oregon (SAA Mark), with a new idea for a classification interview in the annals of Bangkok South Rotary Club - not only let us know the interviewee's classification, do it first.

They then broke into a bit of sports banter, comparing NFL teams they support and their guite different success rates, deflategate and a few other jabs about teams and the best place in Bangkok to watch the Super Bowl.

As expected, the next question was about Rtn Mark's constant wearing of a baseball cap. What was not expected was the story behind it. While Mark was not a very good baseball player, he loved to coach and over the many years, coached over

1,000 Washington and Oregon kids. Invited by the US State Department and the Cuban Government, his 13/14 year-old team (the Washington Wolfpack) was the first American youth to play in Cuba since the Bay of Pigs. Despite playing against Cubans who would soon be in the 'Big Show' in the US, his team won.

Later, at the 1999 World Championships, the team was pegged to win the tournament, but got off to a rocky start losing their first game against the Dominican Republic. It was a double-elimination tourney with 96 teams. In a scene from baseball movies, the coach, Mark, said that he would be proud of them if they ended with a winning record of 3 wins and 2 losses.

The team, however, wanted to know what would happen if they won the next 17 games and won the championship. "What did they want?" he asked. The team responded that "If we win, you will never take off your baseball cap again." The deal was made, and in true 'only the in movies' style, his team went on to win the Championship.



However, the story does not end there. His neighbor, former Oregon Duck (like Mark) and the founder of Nike, saw the story and mentioned that he also always wore his and that if he were to see a picture of Mark without the hat, Mark would lose his house. And, as Paul Harvey would say, "Now you know the rest of the story."

A second story, as is typical of many in the club, was about his first wife (American - 26-year marriage) and second wife (Thai). With two sons from his previous marriage, Mark is now the proud father of an "unexpected" young daughter we all know he dotes on like crazy.

The third and the more involved story was about Mark's venture capital experiences in starting up the Puget Sound Venture Club, which, while he was with it, rejected Starbucks,

"who wants to pay \$2 for a cup of coffee?" and Costco, "who's going to pay for a membership to go shopping?" Having set up a local venture capital club here in Bangkok with some 400 members, they have reviewed over 500 Thai start-ups. Mark also judges various startup competitions in SE Asia and speaks around the region.

He concluded his interview in talking about why Bellevue, Washington has so many billionaires. The answer, Bill Gates has an amazing talent to find talent, who a few years after they join Microsoft, branch out into their own businesses, Zillow, Expedia, Nintendo, GoDaddy, for example are startup ideas from Microsoft alums and were founded in the Seattle area. What is needed, he said, is a core business that brings in the talent. Mark is in the midst of two startups in the Nutraceutical and real estate fields in Thailand. These startups keep him very busy getting ready to launch in 2017.

An interesting classification interview, Mark certainly shared teasers from his past and a few previews to his future.




