GIVE PEACE A CHANCE

A Talk from Rotary Peace Fellows from Chulalongkorn University.

Kirk Driver Driver is a Rotarian and was an "on the beat" policeman in Fort Worth, Texas having risen to Captain during his 26 years. After years of law enforcement experience with underprivileged, marginalised communities he came up with an idea. Rather than being (Re-active) he developed a department which was (Pro-active).

Education and job training leading to qualifications and a decent paying wage are crucial to providing stability to the family and maintaining peace in the community, ending the cycle of violence and crime brought on by lack of opportunity.

The task force headed by Kirk goes into the neediest communities and through dialogue and building trust, especially amongst minority communities, discuss specific needs providing lists, forms and practical help to enable families to access Social Services more successfully.

If a man has a well-paying job and his children are getting good education, he has less time and incentive to do something that would jeopardize his livelihood.

"When I came on, it was how many tickets did you write and how many arrests did you make today? But the test of police efficiency is the absence of crime, not tickets and arrests —

Maria Perez started with: Colombia has just signed a peace deal with rebels after 52 years of conflict. A graphic designer and now a Peace emissary, she has lived and worked in Colombia, London, Spain and Sri Lanka where she taught in children's camps and wrote books enabling her to raise money for the library. She was introduced to, and travels globally, on the Peace Boat which takes three, three-month journeys per year to promote Peace, Human Rights and sustainable development.

Peace is about making the right connections and learning from each other which is what Maria and her colleagues are during throughout the world. Now thanks to the Rotary Peace Scholarship, 23 students from diverse countries that have conflict issues can come together and learn from each other.

Based in Medellin, Colombia which, post conflict, is becoming



a thriving city for commerce and arts. Maria organizes student exchange programmes in Latin America. After she returns from Thailand she will help Rotary with projects in Peace and Education and will contribute to her country after 52 years of conflict.

Omid Wali comes from Eastern Afghanistan, Jalalabad, which shares a 150-mile border with Pakistan. There is a devastating problem with atrocious attacks by terrorist groups such as Isis which cause death injury and suffering.

Omid was a Fulbright scholar in USA and completed his post graduate studies in India and on finishing his studies, he returned to help his country. The Afghan Ministry of Higher Education introduced Peace Studies as a mandatory subject at university which will also receive a platform in Secondary and Primary Education. It is all too easy for terrorist groups to brainwash children who are not educated in glorifying their cause. Extremism and fundamentalism has been a serious destabilizing factor for many years He expounded also on exchange of cultural information and ideas. "Youth in Action" means working within society, traditional families and community Elders as well as giving children a better education and to spread the message of peace.

"Too many of us think [peace] is impossible. Too many think it unreal. But that is a dangerous, defeatist belief. It leads to the conclusion that war is inevitable--that mankind is doomed--that we are gripped by forces we cannot control. We need not accept that view. Our problems are manmade--therefore, they can be solved by Man.... John F Kennedy.
