## GLOBAL AND THAILAND ECONOMIC OUTLOOK 2018

Dr Manop Udomkerdmongkol, Vice President, Economic Research and Investor Relations from the United Overseas Bank shared his views on the local economy and what we can expect in the coming months in terms of various economic indicators and trends

An extremely information talk and one that included ideas not yet shared with the public, it was felt best to limit comments to general terms and to avoid sharing too much detail. One of the benefits of attending a meeting not always shared by those who read South Wind.

Thailand's economy is projected to grow at a faster pace despite facing external uncertainties.

In his view for what lies ahead he feels that the Thai economy continued to grow with public spending as a key growth driver. Merchandise exports have been showing signs of recovery, consistent with production of export-oriented industries.

Private consumption, partly supported by the government's tax deductions at the end the year, and private investment, especially in alternative energy, service and transportation, and some exportrelated industries, continued to recover at a gradual pace.



Growth projection for 2017 were forecast at 3.8% as major infrastructure investment projects such as Eastern Economic Corridor development project, motorways, and high-speed rail networks are expected to have significant roles in driving the Thai economy in 2017 and 2018.

He dealt with this topic quite extensively and reviewed the list of major companies expected to set up facilities in the expanding Eastern Economic Corridor further helping to drive growth.

Tourism is expected to continue an expansion trend, and private investment is expected to pick up as the infrastructure projects get under way. In this regard, Dr Manop discussed how the BTS, MRT and the airport had helped some 20 years ago, but that until now, infrastructure projects had not been seen to play a role in the domestic economy. However, as we all know this has changed with extensive commuter lines being built in Bangkok and a possible high-speed train connecting the north and from east to west.

Merchandise exports are projected to improve at a gradual pace as the world economies appear to be in a recovery mode.

To conclude and to give a review of his major comments, a quote from a press release by Dr Manop from last year, adds a few details he mentioned, "Merchandise exports are expected to improve further thanks to demand from advanced and emerging market countries, and tourism is expected to expand steadily. Public expenditure remains a main economic driver." Thailand's government will run a budget deficit of US\$13.5b (THB450b), or 2.8% of GDP, in 2018 to encourage employment and economic recovery. "Private investment is expected to recover at a gradual pace."




