HOW THE TOKYO OLYMPICS SYMBOLIZED JAPAN'S MIRACULOUS MAKEOVER

While Roy Tomizawa, our former club member and today's speaker admitted himself, his title, 1964, the Best Year in Japanese History, might be a bit on the hyperbole side of reviewing the country's history, 1964 does stand out as a turning point in the nation's history and as Roy suggested a moment of national pride and catharsis.

Beginning with a bleak picture of Japan in the early post-war era, one fact stands out as highlighting where they began in 1945 and the heights they reached by 1964.

In 1945, 40 per cent of all urban areas in Japan had been destroyed, in 1964, the nation launched not only the Bullet Train, but the Haneda Monorail, both still in use today and hosted the Olympics, being the first Asian nation to do so.

Roy shared some interesting insights into the time leading up to the Olympics stretching from the US occupation and censorship to the early boom period when the Japanese were given more freedom and with the end of censorship, started to reflect, symbolically criticize their occupiers, among other ways with the launch of the highly successful Godzilla movies, perhaps the first opportunity many of us had to glimpse modern Japan.

In his research, Roy has also found the importance played by Professional wrestling and the classic scenario of the smaller competitor taking on and defeating the larger opponent.

This very interesting idea culminated, he suggested in the final match in the no weight class judo gold-medal bout between



Anton Geesing, who at two meters and 120 kilos towered over his Japanese opponent Akio Kaminaga at only 1.75 meters and 102 kilos.

23 October 1964, the nations waited expectantly hoping and praying their man could overcome the odds and emerge victorious. Geesing won and the nation was devastated and that cathartic moment of national pride was denied, only temporarily though.

On the same day though, that purifying moment came, when Japan's woman's volleyball team was preparing to take on a larger, stronger adversary, the USSR. However, the Japanese won in three straight sets.

Another interesting side-bar and insight, in addition to the idea Godzilla was, in fact, a direct criticism of US nuclear testing at the time, was the story about Yoshinori Sakai, the final torch bearer who lit the Tokyo Olympic cauldron. Although a runner, he never competed in the Olympics but was chosen to light the cauldron for symbolism as he was born on 6 August 1945, in Miyoshi Hiroshima, the day the atomic bomb was dropped on that city.

According to Roy, this match, watched by the highest rated television audience program in history, Japan re-gained its confidence and moved into the modern era of growth and development that entrances so many visitors today.

An interesting hypothesis and one that Roy has developed through extensive research and interviews with many who were there, it will be very interesting to read his book when it is completed.

Details of the 17 to 22/23 June trip are as follows

All systems on the trip are Sponsored by C&C Travel of Denmark who have offered us another ten systems in RY 2018-9. Representatives of C&C will travel with us.

June 17: meet up in Chiang Mai and overnight there.

June 18: drive to Fang district of Chiang Mai and inaugurate a CDWS at Tung Luuk School in the afternoon together with RC Fang. Then drive to Chiang Rai and overnight there.

June 19: Drive from Chiang Rai to Phan District, Chiang Rai Province and inaugurate, together with RC Phan, a CDWS at Phan Phiset School in the morning and Pah Deang Wittaya School in the afternoon. Subsequently, drive to Phrae city and overnight there.

June 20: in the morning inaugurate, together with RC Phrae a CDWS at Muang Khai School and then drive to Li District, Lamphun Province to overnight in Li.

June 21: inaugurate, together with RC Chiang Mai Airport, a CDWS at Pah Phai School in Li then drive to Mae Sod District, Tak province to overnight in Mae Sod.

June 22: drive to Mae Tarn and inaugurate, together with RC Mae Sod-Muangchon, a CDWS at Ban Mae Tarn School in the morning, then return to Mae Sod.

Participants may then fly back to BKK from Mae Sod Airport on Nok Air on 22 June evening flight. Or stay one more night and take the morning flight on the 23.

Transport throughout the week will be in a comfortable 11-seater van. A second one can be hired if needed. Or you can drive your own car. You can join us for the whole week or select just one part of the trip.
