

I look forward to working beside you as we come together to **Create Hope in the World.**



Dear Fellow Rotary Club Bangkok South Members,

With the support of all of the subcommittee chairs, we were able to achieve our primary committee goal of achieving 10 Paul Harris Fellows - Thank You PP Nick! Just as important, we established greater synergies among the subcommittees and other RCBS Committees by helping secure Global Grant projects (PP Krit) with RC Lopburi Pranarai via International Twin Clubs (Rtn. Moto) funding from Japan and combining 4-Way Test (Rtn. Paul) Awareness across RCBS members via introduction of a new nomination and onboarding process criteria to the Membership Committee. We continue to support Polio Plus (PP Vichai) along with our District events. We also continue domestic and international activities and events of our Youth Rotaracts and Interacts (PN Worrakit). Our Luang Sit Fellows (PP Ole) contributions remains stable and we will being reinstating requests for support of the Luang Sit Foundations during the next Rotary Year under the leadership of PE Aaron. Thank you President Patrick for your kind support during your auspicious Year - we sincerely appreciated your frequent visits to our committee meetings.

LUANG SIT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Chair PP Ole Madsen

The LS Scholarship program consist of two components:

1. The Luang Sit Fellowship Program established in 1985, supporters are called Luang Sit Fellows, LSF, who sponsor one or more Scholarships for 4 years/Baht 10,000 per year for needy students, who are doing well in school, but whose parents are extremely poor earners not able to support a university education for their children.

This year 88 LSFs support 113 students.

Details of Luang Sit students are provided to their sponsors with official receipt in December.

Please note the LS is the only charity program in our club that can provide tax deductible privilege on both a personal and corporate basis.

2. An endowment fund named the Luang Sit Sayamkarn Fund established in 1964, which over the years have accumulated 2.3 million Baht from donations by members, family and friends on birthdays, anniversaries, weddings, and other special occasions. The funds are kept on term deposit generating yearly interest which are used for additional scholarships.

We have lately due to the pandemic not been asking members to donate on special days, however, we would like to ask members to start donating again in the tradition which goes back to 1964.







Service Projects-Annual Report

2022-2023

Let's start this 2022-23 report with some facts and figures: 33 projects completed, 2MB allocated, 4,100 children helped, 120 sick adults supported and a few gibbons locked away! All by a fantastic roaster of 17 Rotarians, some wise and experienced, some just younger.

All these service projects were made possible by our fund raising teams, past and present, the relentless advocacy from our members who secured significant donations to our club, and last but not least, the dedication and commitment of the service projects owners. I would like to take a moment to thank all my fellow Service Projects Committee members: you gave your time, you gave your thoughts and ideas, you got our club's help and resources where it was needed. A fine team representing a fine club.

I realize I need one more "last but not least": I would like to grab this opportunity to show my gratitude and appreciation to our President Patrick Shrimp Gauvin. It's very much in line with your positivity and open mindedness to appoint a new and unproven Rotarian to your board. The experience made me realize that being a Rotarian extends way beyond our fellowship times and that it connects us to the communities of the wonderful country we all have elected to live in. And yes that is word for word what is being told to every new Rotarian during induction, I just needed to live it to realize its full meaning. So thank you President.

I have been told that VP Sanjeev did a much better job than I could ever have done of presenting my slide at the Club's General Assembly, but just to reiterate his points, we started the 2022-23 Service Projects year with one clear intention: reconnect with all our projects with whom it was difficult to keep contact with during 2 years of Covid and prioritize who needed our help the most. The Baan Bang Boon AIDS hospice right away jumped at us as being in dire conditions. The Board saw the necessity to go the extra mile and agreed to release additional funding. It is impossible not to single out Rtn. Chip Bowness who acted as adviser, project manager, worker and overall driving force behind the renovation project, which included sanitation, foundation & structure of the main area, storage and roofing isolation. An engineering and humanitarian feat.

Another project in need of short term relief was the Thai Children Development Foundation. It had established a self-sustaining funding model based on agriculture and tourism income sources. Covid dried up these revenue streams. We helped by providing material support towards the end of 2022, just long enough until its level of revenue generating activities were self-supporting again. TCDF provides educational support to 530 kids suffering from autism and learning disabilities and whose families are not equipped for supporting children with special needs.

FORDEC is a long time friend of RCBS. Dr. Armporn is another example of one person dedicating his life and personal resources to helping others, orphans in this case. Our club has been a long term supporter by providing health and education programs to the kids.

The Clean Drinking Water Project team reviewed the existing systems and undertook maintenance before focusing on new systems installation in the second half of the year. This has been our signature project for years with now over 100 schools covered. In 2022-23, we added 5 new schools. I'd like to explain a little bit about what goes into selecting a school. First, we need to identify a school that could meet our criteria – a minimum of 150 children, a school removed from the main water infrastructure, and a school willing to collaborate with a Rotary club. The water quality needs to be tested. Each CDWS installation also requires to find a sponsor that will finance 50% of the new system. In other words, that is thousands of kilometers driven every year, working with schools, sponsors and suppliers to coordinate the installation and maintenance of systems, and checking that schools meet their obligations.

I understand we said we wouldn't name names, but I have to highlight the reactivity of PP David Record who jumped in to lend his energy to Kids Day Out and to John Quarmby who didn't know it but became the de facto KDO chair for the official relaunch of this fun day after 2 years of Covid imposed interruption. And all of you who attended to make this a great day for the kids and for us.

We have had many other projects from teaching sign language to parents and educators of deaf children, de-worming 600 kids, repairing a canteen, and many more. I just would like to end this year review by mentioning a new project that is close to all of us: the Klongtoei housing project for orphans. We all pass by Klongtoei everyday. Next time you do so, you'll know that 30 kids now have a safe place to stay thanks to RCBS.

One last thank to Khun Khob who took her job of reminding me of my duties and obligations with heart.

Thai Child Development

Our club has contributed twice in the past year to the work of this great organization based in a mountain forest in Ranong. The organization provides care to disadvantages kids all over the country, although the emphasis of its work is in the Ranong region. It maintains a school center where daily a few dozen children are welcomed, transported by a school bus from the neighbouring villages. The Foundation explicitly does not want to be an orphanage, as the children which receive help are always staying with their families. Right now around 400 children receive help from the TCDF.

Last year the RCBS together with our sister club in Hua Hin provided support for the construction of a shelter for the school bus. At the end of last year we provided further support for medical care (tube feeding, oxygen tanks, specialized milk products etc.).

From 7 to 9 February 2023 Rtn Arie together with Rtn Gerard Geraets (from Holland) paid a visit to the TCF in Ranong. It exists now almost 20 years and has developed a sustainable way of working by generating income from its own farm, shop and holiday accommodation. Due to the Covid pandemic, however, the sources of income dried up completely, but right now it is returning to normal, although financial support remains highly needed for the time to come.

The Rotary visitors were accommodated in some of the three beautiful eco lodges on the mountainous forest terrain of the TCDF. We had extensive discussions with Rosalie Tieges, the Dutch lady that established the TCDF almost 20 years ago, and members of its Thai board about their plans for moving forward with the great work they are doing.

We discovered that the TCDF is a wonderful and impressive organization which definitely deserves our help. And it is more than worth a visit which is easy as it is located very close to Ranong airport.

Happy Home Children Centre (HHCC) in Battambang























Since 2012 our Rotary club provides regular support for the functioning of this Centre which is located in one of the poorest areas in Cambodia. The Centre has been established in 2007 with the help of the Dutch Float Foundation. Over the years it has accommodated many hundreds of orphans or children from highly disadvantaged families. About five years ago the center was renamed into HHCC in order to reflect its present nature.

At present around 25 children are taken care of by the Cambodian Children and Poor Community Development Organization (CPCDO). Its facilities are basic, but in line with the Ministry of Social Affairs which is not only controlling the center, but it also regularly refers children to the center. The HHCC is also providing support for a few children which are staying with family members.

The Rotary support has been provided by several clubs. Initiated by the RCBS, also the Minerva club in Amsterdam (Netherlands) provided generous support and more recently also the Canadian Rotary Club of South Surrey (RCSS). As a matter of fact this last club has provided very substantial support in the past few years in order to revamp the poor housing facilities into a modern structure. Last year our club member Chip Bowness and the RCSS project manager Brian O'Ruairc spent a few months in the region in order to implement the work. The RCSS raised \$40,000 for the reconstruction work.

Over the years our RCBS has regularly provided support for the center, in particular, in the area of education facilities, drawing and painting lessons, medical help as well as a few emergency packages to help the children during the Covid pandemic. The last RCBS club delegation to Battambang took place last year October, organized by Rtn Arie Bloed on behalf of our club.

After more than 16 years of providing the core funding for the center, the Float Foundation was able to transfer its task to our Canadian friends of South Surrey which created their own charity organization for that purpose.

House in the Klong Toei Slum









We supported the Bangkok Community Help Foundation (BCHF) in building a house (and contents) within the Klong Toei Slum DISTRICT

This project was to build a house for an extremely disadvantaged extended family, with 22 children. Prior to the building of this 4-bedroom Double Story House the family lived in one small room - no running water, no sewerage facilities, and no electricity.

The Project was completed on the 9th April 2023 after a lot of hard work over a 6 months period by the Director's and supports of BCHF.

To fund this project our club donated 125,000thb and The Rotary club of Lee's Summit (USA) donated 30,000Thb.

Also I was able to raise "external donations" from caring individuals, namely Ian Cunningham, Tobby Larisch, Jay Kim and myself totalling 155,000thb.

The children of this extremely disadvantaged family now have a safer environment to live, and the 4 bedroom's enable the children (some adolescent boys and girls) to be separated, providing a safer and healthier place for them to sleep.

The Klong Toei slum District is recognized as the largest and most disadvantaged urban District within all of Thailand, with over 150,000 people living within a 3 square Kilometre area. For most, the living conditions are incredibility basic and confronting without access to even the most basic of life's simple necessaries.

For these children, our Club's involvement has made a huge positive difference to their life's.

I would like to thank our Services Committee Members and our BODs for approving this Project.

RCBS has been supplying Library Kits to needy schools for over twenty years. The kits consist of two packs, 140 books selected by Chula Graduate Institute and 40 Manga 'Why' books. These are educational comic style books covering a wide range of topics such as space, mechanics and careers. The books are for Thai students from 6 to 12 and are often given to schools who have received a Clean Drinking Water system.

A kit costs Baht 16,000 and is usually donated by individual Rotarians, often this is done to celebrate birthdays or anniversaries. The donor can nominate a school of their choice or let the Library team select a school.

This year, we proudly donated 9 kits to schools across Thailand.

by our PP Philip Bächtold


Less than half a year ago our PP Philip Bächtold introduced his biography/ memoir to the RCBS audience and many club members bought a copy. It bears the eloquent title 'My Great Ride' which indeed it has been. The author was so kind to sign quite a few books for RCBS members who bought it. After just finishing most of the book I decided that it's time to write a review, as all serious books deserve and as a reminder to all those who didn't get the book yet to try to get a copy of it (and to those who bought it but didn't read it yet: read it!). And serious is this book for sure. It describes -- in great detail -- the ins and outs and ups and downs of a creative and artistic Swiss businessman in Thailand, but also of a dedicated Rotarian, a passionate family man and an addicted motorbike driver. Members will remember that Philip had to pay a price for this last hobby when again he showed up in bandages at the Rotary events.

The most interesting part of this book for me was the lively description of the political waves which Thailand had to endure in the past forty years and which consequences they had on the life of the business community with a focus on the Bächtold business in luxury gems, watches, and jewellery. But even more interesting for our club are the wonderful stories about his membership of RCBS and the many anecdotes about longstanding members of this club such as Marco Casanova, PP Vichai Tantrativud, PP Nitti Meyer, PP Andrew McPherson, Rod Vergara and others.

Interesting was how Philip became a member, deeply impressed by a talented speaker at a Friday lunch (which shows again how important the quality of the speakers at our lunches are for a healthy RCBS membership). Already for this reason all present club members should get a copy of the book and read the relevant parts. Honestly, there aren't that many books (if at all) which contain such interesting and often intimate stories related to our own club. Yes, we have the jubilee books published by our club, but those are very different from the very personal views one can find in Philip's memoir. For all those who know him or think to know him, read his book and you'll discover that you never knew him (and maybe the RCBS) well enough!

Of course, the book has been written first for his own family, but our club has been an integral part of Philip's life since the 1990s. I would say: obligatory reading for our members.
